Opportunities to serve scouting as a member of a seasonal camp staff are available to outstanding applicants.

As a Camp Shands staff member, the job is demanding and the experience is exhilarating! The benefits of being a Camp Shands Staff Member includes learning new skill sets with public speaking, teaching, and leadership. Some positions will lead you to be certified as a lifeguard, Cope/Climbing Instructor, etc. As a staff member you can impact the lives of others, over 60% of the campers are there for the first time. You can be that role model that carries them through the path to Eagle!

Requirements for joining the Camp Shands Staff:

- Any person wanting to be considered for employment must submit this application. This includes any person wishing to be paid, counselor in training or volunteer.
- The preferred minimum age required is 16. Candidates that are 14 and 15 years old may apply to be unpaid counselors in training. Boy Scouts of America standards require age 21 minimum for some positions as indicated in the camp positions list.
- Applicants must be registered members of the Boy Scouts of America or agree to become registered before employment begins.
- Applicants accepted for employment are hired on a temporary basis and employment is based upon the continued satisfaction and needs of the camp.
- Salary is based on position responsibility with consideration given to the individual's experience.
- All Camp Shands employees working in the United States are required to complete the Employment Eligibility Verification (I-9) form.
- All Camp Shands staff members must successfully pass a level two background check and drug test prior to the start of any staff developments and/or position including CITs and volunteers.
- Employment positions are open to all within our guidelines regardless of race, creed, gender, national origin, age, marital status or sexual orientation.

Application Instructions:

- Review the list of jobs, indicate your four preferences, and complete the entire application even if you have worked at Camp Shands before. Applicants who list a variety of job preferences have a better chance at placement than those listing one choice.
- Send your application soon. Opportunities for employment are better for those who apply early. Camp Shands will notify you to schedule an interview (check your email often). Director selection will begin in October and general staff will begin in January.
